

The 7 families Rules of the game

Deal 7 cards to each player. The remaining cards go to the stock.

The first player asks another player if he has the card he wants. If the other player has it, he must give away the card. Then the first player is entitled to ask another card he wants to any other player. If this one does not have it, the first player has to pick up a card from the stock.

If doing so he gets the requested card he says: « Good one ». If he doesn't he gives way to the player to his left.

Each time a player picks up a card from the stock or gets it from another player; he must read aloud the message on it to the other players. One of the families is not environment friendly in order to raise awareness about what mustn't be done.

When a player has in his possession a complete family (6 members) he displays it in front of him. The game goes on until all families are completed.

The winner is the player who has the most families.
